What to do When Your Dog Comes Home After Surgery

Keep your dog calm and quiet for the rest of the day. Put him or her in a quiet room or crate. Do not play with your pet or allow any jumping or running. Use a leash when walking outside. Too much activity too soon after surgery can make the surgery area painful and can cause vomiting. You can treat your dog normally the next day.

Your dog may vomit one to several times the day he or she comes home, but should be fine by the next day. People who have had surgery know that you sometimes feel nauseous due to the anesthesia.

Do not feed your dog until the next day. A little water late in the day is OK. If you offer food too soon, your pet may vomit.

Do not allow your dog to lick the surgery area. If he or she insists on licking, stop by and pick up a plastic Elizabethan (bucket/cone-type) collar.

A few dogs may still seem a little uncomfortable for a day or so after surgery. All dogs get a shot of pain medication before surgery, but some dogs are just a little more sensitive than others. Small breed dogs, especially, may shake a little the next day. Make sure you give your pet all the pain meds we give to you.

It may take several days for your dog to return to completely normal behavior. Most dogs are fine the next day, but a few animals take their time to return to their old selves, so do not worry. Call us if you have any questions.
