- Would you like **full mouth dental radiographs** today? These are strongly recommended to fully evaluate the teeth (crown and root). Without radiographs, dental lesions may be missed and cause pain for your pet later.
 Would you like your pet's nails trimmed today?

Anesthesia is used for this procedure. Laboratory testing before anesthesia increases the safety level for you pet. Pre-surgical blood testing is done in-house and helps us tailor your pet's anesthesia protocol.

The following tests are recommended for your pet prior to anesthesia. Please INITIAL the box of the tests you would like performed for your pet's safety:

- Accept Decline ***For pet's under 7 years of age we recommend:***
- Vetscan Prep Profile serum biochemistry (5 tests that check kidney function, liver function, blood sugar, and blood protein)
 CBC (checks for anemia, blood clotting, dehydration, infection)
 EKG (evaluates heart size, rhythm, and conduction)

- For pet's 7 years of age and older, we recommend:***
- Vetscan Profile plus serum biochemistry (12 tests that check kidney function, liver function, blood sugar, blood proteins, cholesterol, potassium, calcium, and pancreatic function)
 CBC (checks for anemia, blood clotting, dehydration, infection)
 EKG (evaluates heart size, rhythm, and conduction)

I am the owner of _____ or acting as the owner's agent with his/her full knowledge and approval. I hereby consent to all dental treatment noted above and any treatment or emergency measures which may be needed as a result. Risks with anesthetic procedures can include death and results can not be guaranteed. I also understand that no staff member will be on duty after hours and I may take my pet home or to the Nashville Pet Emergency Clinic if overnight observation is needed or preferred. I understand prior to anesthesia: (A) All animals should be up to date on vaccines for at least 10 days. (B) All animals, except some exotics, should be fasted overnight (food and water). (C) Dogs and cats should be on heartworm prevention and tested yearly or tested prior to surgery for heartworms. (D) Bloodwork should be done before any anesthetic procedure. (E) Omission of any of these measures may increase the normal risk of anesthetic complications, such as death, that is present with any anesthetic procedure.
