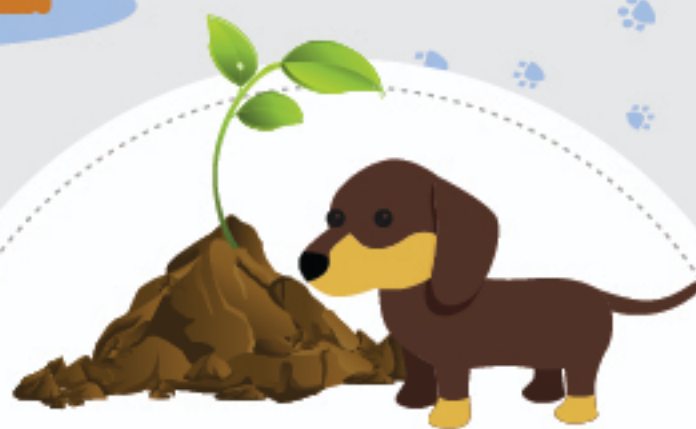


## Use pet-friendly cleaning products

in your home or follow cleaning labels.  
(Keep products stored safely.)

## Be aware of chemicals,

including fertilizers & pesticides, used on your lawn or garden.

Flowers such as daffodils and tulips are dangerous to pets. Veggie/fruit items like onions and grapes are highly toxic.
