And on a minor (yet still very important) level:

Paperless practice management system, Digital X-ray technology, rainwater collection system, special flooring materials, parking lot design and materials and special cleaning materials.

Obviously we finish with recycling of waste and reminding everyone about how precious our energy is and the many ways they too can help in this battle.

Building an eco friendly hospital was significantly more costly up front. However, when you evaluate the long term cost savings and the amount of energy that we are saving every day, the choice was easy to make. Everyone who works at this hospital takes immense pride in our facility and what we have accomplished. One can actually see the energy we are saving daily, monthly or yearly on our website. Even our clients are excited about the building and what it represents.

There are many programs available for the future builder of a facility such as this. We were awarded a sizable grant from the USDA to help with the up front costs of the solar panels. There are many such grants available at the moment. Often local and state governments will also have programs available to the eco-conscious builder. It just takes patience (paperwork can be tedious) and persistence.

Every year innovative new products are being created to make this approach not only easier but more esthetic; solar panels are not the most pleasing sight on a roof and I recently learned of both tiles and shingles which have been developed to replace those panels and blend well with the existing roof.
